Eagle Harbor Conservation & Recreation Area

Bring your family and join **Erik Lilleskov**, a scientist with the USDA Forest Research Lab in Houghton, and **Joan Chadde**, an environmental educator. We'll walk 2-3 miles around Long Lake (shorter options are available), listen for frogs, and use nets to sample the abundant life found in this diverse wetland complex.

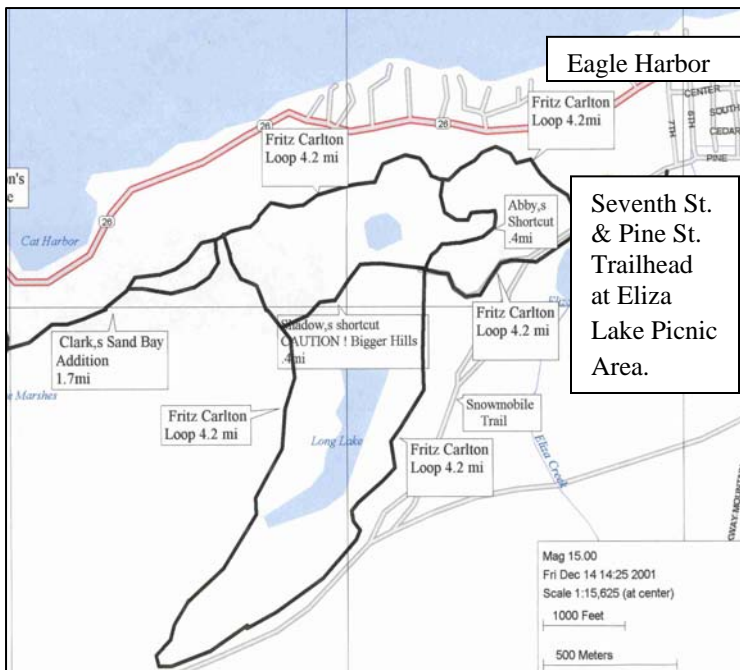


Getting There

We'll meet at the trailhead at Eliza Lake Park, at the end of Pine Street. Follow US 41 north of Phoenix, and turn west on the Eagle Harbor Road. When you reach Eagle Harbor, turn left onto Pine Street and drive several blocks, past Seventh Street and the Pine Grove Cemetery (on right), to the trailhead. Park along the street. (Note: parts of this trail traverse private property. Please be courteous.)

Come Prepared

Wear waterproof walking shoes and dress warmly. Bring a hat, gloves, an extra layer of warm clothing



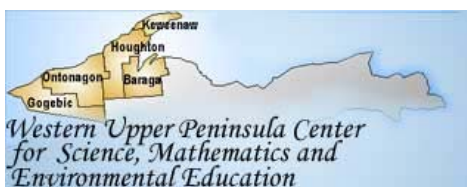
This complex of protected lands includes the Eagle Harbor Township Conservation & Recreation area, two Michigan Nature Association (MNA) sanctuaries---Cy Clark Memorial and Eagle Harbor Red Pines Sanctuaries, and the Keweenaw Land Trust's George Hite Dunes & Marshes Conservation Easement. In addition, MNA's Redwyn Dunes Nature Sanctuary is located just south of this large conservation area.
